



Two teachers from the Department of Commerce have been registered for Ph.D and have published several papers in highly reputed National and International Journals and also presented research papers in State level and National seminars and conferences.





Weakness


- ➤ Required teaching faculty is not fulfilled due to the recruitment policy of the state government.
